Canada and the United States The late Caroline Cox drew extensively on Revolutionary War pension applications in her research for Boy Soldiers of the American Revolution. In this study she defines boy soldiers as those who served while sixteen years old or younger. (Strikingly, boys as young as nine or ten often attempted to enlist.)

The child soldiers of the American Civil War were often musicians, drummers, scouts, servants, or messengers who marched alongside fighting men. Others, however, experienced the violence firsthand. Some served as "powder monkeys" on warships, carrying gunpowder to the cannons.

Edward (William) Black (1853-1872) was a drummer boy for the Union during the American Civil War. At twelve years old, his left hand and arm were shattered by an exploding shell. He is considered to be the youngest wounded soldier of the war.

Typical of them was sixteen year old William Diamond who signed up as drummer boy in the Lexington, Massachusetts, militia company. On April 19, 1775, William Diamond beat "to arms" on his brightly painted drum. That sound brought 70 militiamen to confront approaching British regulars.
