Shot types
Shot type Explanation and effect
Establishing shot Places the characters and action in a context
Long shot Shows the whole subject, with room to spare at the top and bottom of the frame
Medium shot Shows the figure from the waist up
Two shot Shows two people in medium-long shot to show conversations

STYLE: The manner in which a film conveys its ideas, how the film conveys an attitude towards the material in cinematic terms. A film's style is influenced by mode of production, country, period, and conventions, and the particular director's artistic choices.

glossary of film terms: as film studies. ACCELERATED MOTION – movement in a shot is represented at greater speed than in reality. This can be achieved by filming at 18 frames per second rather than the standard 24, so that when the film is played back at 24 fps the motion appears faster.
