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Use one strip at a time and get rid of excess adhesive from each strip over the bowl by running your fingers lightly over it. This will conserve your mixture but also make sure your planets are not too soggy. 3. Add the papier-mâché to the balloons. Drape the wet newspaper strips across the surface of each balloon.

First, you'll need to create the paper mache. This is very simple. Mix 1 part flour to 2 parts water. Stir until there are few lumps left in the bowl. It should be runny, not thick. You'll need to make quite a bit to have enough for a whole class (more than I made). I would fill the entire bowl to start out.

Mix 2 cups of flour, 2 cups of water and 1/3 cup glue in a large bowl. This is the paste mixture for the papier-mâché. If you run out, you can make more by adding equal parts flour and water and a small squirt of glue. The mixture can be stored overnight in the refrigerator if needed.

We could paint them on paper, but that didn't feel realistic enough. We could buy a solar system set, but where's the fun in that? So we went with creating our own planets. By using paper mache and balloons. Let's talk about the process of making a paper mache planet so that you can get to work on making some of your very own.

### **How to Make Paper Mache Planets - The Parent Collaboratory**

Make the paper mache paste by combining  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup flour and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cups water in a small pot. Bring the mixture to a boil for three minutes while stirring. Turn off the heat, stop stirring, and let the paste cool for about 30 minutes. Earth's diameter is 109 times smaller than the Sun's, so your model Earth should be  $30 \text{ cm} / 109 = 0.3 \text{ cm}$  in diameter.

### **Model the Sun and Earth**

This Paper Mache Solar System Lesson Plan is suitable for 1st - 4th Grade. Learners make a model of the solar system. For this solar system lesson, students make paper mache models of the planets to hand in the classroom, measure the distance to each planet scaled with footsteps, and model the moon's movement with a lamp and ball.

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### **Paper Mache Solar System Lesson Plan for 1st - 4th Grade ...**

If you build your solar system on a roll of toilet paper, you can make the Sun about .4 inches (10 mm) across and still fit the entire solar system on the roll. A standard roll of toilet paper has about 450 sheets that are about 4.375 inches long, hence the roll is about 164 feet long. (N.B. Check your toilet paper for length.

Cut strips of newspaper. Blow up one balloon for each planet in various sizes (Jupiter, Mars, Uranus, Neptune, Earth, Saturn, Mercury, Venus). Mix 1 cup flour with 2 cups water. Dip the strips of newspaper into the flour mixture and place on the balloon.
