How to Write a Discussion Section | Checklist and Examples

Keep the number of questions reasonable (under 10, if possible). This prevents the participants from getting confused or worn out by a long discussion. Keep the questions simple and short. FGD participants won't get the chance to see the questions like in a survey. Ensure that the wording on questions is clear.
