For young children, nursery rhymes are especially helpful for language and early literacy development. Play audiobooks or read aloud at home to increase the amount of language your child hears. Hang different kinds of print around your house. Label objects in your home. This can show the importance of language, reading, and writing.

Early language and literacy (reading and writing) development begins in the first 3 years of life and is closely linked to a child's earliest experiences with books and stories. The interactions that young children have with such literacy materials as books, paper, and crayons, and with the adults in their lives are the building blocks for language, reading, and writing development.

What We Know About Early Literacy and Language Development ...

Reading bedtime stories to your child is great; it promotes early literacy and fosters a love for reading, all while providing an important parent/child bonding time that increases your child's social and cognitive development. But simply reading a book alone isn't enough to develop crucial early literacy skills like those mentioned above.

A Parent's Role in Early Literacy Education

Early childhood teachers play a key role as children develop literacy. While this cluster does not cover the basics of reading instruction, it offers classroom-tested ways to make common practices like read alouds and discussions even more effective.
